

Helpful Tips About Household Hazardous Products!

- **READ THE LABEL!** The correct label provides directions for use, storage guidelines, disposal directions, and proper accidental poisoning treatment recommendations.
- Keep unused products in their original container.
- Be aware of the uses and dangers of products. If the directions are unclear, contact the manufacturer before using.
- Never mix different products. Explosive or poisonous chemical reactions may occur.
- Use the exact amount specified in the directions.
- Avoid skin contact and breathing in fumes. Wear proper protective equipment.
- Properly dispose of hazardous products. Never dispose of products containing harmful chemicals down the drain, in rivers, or lakes.
- Empty containers can go into the garbage.
- If you are finished with them and the products are still usable (have not been recalled, the label is still legible, the container is intact) find a friend, neighbor, or business that can use up excess product.

When is Waste Considered Hazardous?

Wastes are considered hazardous when they adversely affect humans or react dangerously with other chemicals. They are usually grouped into these five categories:

Caustic: if they destroy tissue or corrode metal

Explosive: if they react violently with exposure to other chemicals or heat

Infectious: if they can cause or transmit disease

Radioactive: if they give off radioactive Particles

Toxic: if they are poisonous

- Ammunition or explosives—Contact your local Police or Sheriff Department
- Radioactive materials—Contact specialist
- Fire extinguishers— Call (641) 485-9046
- Latex paint—see information below
- Material in containers larger than **5 gallons**—Contact 1-888-603-2739
- Asbestos— For information relating to disposal of asbestos containing material, contact the landfill @ (641) 752-0646.
- Propane cylinders—Contact the landfill
- Empty containers—Dispose of as garbage

Proper Disposal of Latex Paint

- Give away unused latex paint to a friend or a non-profit group (ex. housing project, school, or church group).
- Small quantities of latex paint can be dried by removing the lid and allowing the paint to dry. Keep it in a well ventilated area.
- Large quantities of latex paint can be poured in layers in a cardboard box/lid lined with plastic or newspaper.
- Stir kitty litter or dirt into the latex paint until it is an oatmeal-like consistency.
- Completely dried and hardened latex paint can be placed in your regular trash. Leave the lids off.
