Remember to wash/rinse all containers.

Items that **can not** be accepted :

- Containers that contained poison or weed killer.
- Car parts
- Fast food cups/containers
- Items with grease or food residue.
- Spray cans
- Styrofoam
- Pizza boxes
- Plastic bags

Aluminum and tin*

Rinse clean. Loose lids can be thrown in the trash.

- Food cans
- Drink cans

Plastics*

Rinse clean and lids go into the trash. If the container held motor oil or poison it goes into the trash.

- Marked #1 or #2
- Drink containers
- Milk jugs
- Soap bottles

***Aluminum and plastics can be stored in the same container.**

Paper

Soiled materials such as used paper plates and napkins go into the trash.

- Newspapers
- Magazines
- Catalogs
- Phone books
- Junk mail
- Writing paper

Cardboard

Clean cardboard must be flattened and other material removed from inside.

- Toilet paper rolls
- Tissue boxes
- Dry food boxes

****No Pizza Boxes**

Keep Cardboard and paper separated.

Glass

Rinse and leave labels on. Lids, rings, and broken glass go into the trash.

- Food jars
- Vases
- Bottles

For safety, store glass separately from other materials and handle with care.

Marshall county has had mandatory recycling since 1995. Recycling items keeps the cost of landfilling affordable and saves valuable landfill space and the environment.
