Fees:

MARSHALL COUNTY LANDFILL SERVICE AREA

Since 1995 our service area by the ordinance of all towns and the rural areas has had mandatory recycling. Recycling keeps our rates affordable and protects the environment. See page 4 for details.

****Loads entering the landfill that are not properly covered/secure will be assessed a \$20 (for small loads) or \$40 (for large loads) fee ****

Cover loads:

Local ordinances require <u>all</u> loads of garbage taken to the landfill to be covered.

Covering a load of garbage protects:

- -Vehicles traveling behind from flying debris.
- -The environment and residents from litter along the roadways.

Appropriate cover can be one of the following:

- -A canvas cover
- -A tied down piece of plywood
- -A material which entirely covers the load and is securely tied down

LANDFILL RECYCLING AREA ITEMS

Please <u>STOP</u> at the scale house prior to weighing in if you have any of these items. These items are <u>NOT</u> weighed.



APPLIANCES Cost: \$10.00 Each

Examples of appliances: Dishwashers, Washers, Dryers, Hot Water Heaters, Furnaces, Stoves, Dehumidifiers, Microwaves, Air Conditioners, Refrigerators, and Freezers.

LEAD ACID BATTERIES Cost: Free

When buying a new battery ask the retailer to take the old battery. You can also recycle lead acid batteries at the landfill for no charge.





MOTOR OIL Cost: Free

Motor oil used by residents and not contaminated with other products can be recycled into the landfill's oil container. Please limit to 5 gallons. You can return used oil to purchased location or ask for a list of local shops that burn used oil for heating!

PROPANE TANKS Cost: \$6.00

Large tanks are accepted for recycling only. We do not accept tanks with Acetylene. Check with a local dealer to recycle those tanks.



SCRAP METAL Cost: Free

Can be recycled at the landfill, at a metal recycler, or a salvage yard, Examples: angle iron, bed frames, bicycles, lawn chairs, lawn mowers (drain all fluids), metal grills, and large metal objects. If you aren't sure if it is considered metal, just ask!

TIRES Cost: \$325 per ton for large loads

It is illegal in the State of lowa and it is prohibited at all landfills.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS MATERIALS INFORMATION

- Appointments must be made to bring Household Hazardous Materials (HHM) to the landfill satellite building.
- Call 641-752-0646 for an appointment. Items are accepted between 9:00am—3:00pm at no charge to residents. Identify the materials and the quantity of items being dropped off. Please try to keep the materials in the original container or a closed container marked with the contents.
- *Sharps <u>must</u> be in either a red sharps plastic container or a hard plastic detergent bottle. The detergent bottle must have the cap screwed on and sealed with duct tape.

No milk jugs are allowed. These are DOT Guidelines.

Items **NOT** Accepted

- -Ammunition or explosives: contact your local Police or Sheriff Department
- -<u>Asbestos</u>: For information relating to disposal of asbestos containing material, contact the landfill (641)752-0646.
- -Fire extinguishers: Call (641)485-9046.
- -Latex paint: can be dried out and thrown away.

REGIONAL COLLECTION CENTER FOR BUSINESS AND FARM CHEMICALS

Any business that generates small amounts of hazardous materials may use the Metro Hazardous Material Drop-Off. There is a fee for businesses based on the amount and type of hazardous materials brought to the facility. RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING INFORMATION

The Marshall County Landfill Service Area by the ordinance of all towns and in the rural area has had mandatory recycling since 1995. Recycling items keeps the cost of landfilling affordable and saves landfill space and the environment.

RECYCLING DROP OFF CENTER @Marshall County Landfill

Residential Recycling may be brought to the landfill for drop off during regular business hours for a minimum fee of \$5.00.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR RECYCLING



Paper Products

Newspapers & like items such as: coupon inserts, magazines, catalogs, phone books, and junk mail should be put separately in the bin. Put soiled paper in the trash.



Corrugated Cardboard and Paperboard

Must be clean and flattened.

Wax coated, soiled cardboard or paperboard put in the trash—ex. Pizza boxes



#1 & #2 Plastic Food & Beverage Containers

Rinse the containers clean and leave labels on. Lids go in the trash. Empty plastics that contained motor oil or contaminated materials go in the trash.



Glass

Rinse the containers clean and leave labels on. Lids, rings, and broken glass go in the trash. Check with your recycler for instructions on larger glass items.



<u>Tin Cans</u>

Rinse clean and remove labels and toss loose lids into the trash. **Tin can be stored with plastics.

COMPOSTING:

The landfill does <u>not</u> accept any trees, branches, leaves, or yard and garden waste for disposal. These items should go to the City of Marshalltown Compost Facility at 900 Woodland St. (641) 754-5745
